

The SDGs are a global commitment that marks a vision for societies to prosper, and the road towards the SDGs is paved through effective governance. This session will present an overview of three key dimensions to peaceful, just and inclusive societies in the region and an analysis of opportunities towards achieving the targets of SDG 16.

SESSION 2: INTERLINKAGES BETWEEN SDG 16 AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES

The 2030 Agenda in general, and SDG 16 in particular, are about enabling opportunities for people to lead their lives in a sustainable and equitable manner. Latin America and the Caribbean has made progress in many indicators of human development, however socio-economic challenges such as high rates of inequality, corruption, citizen insecurity, gender-based violence and others, are having an impact on the region in terms of development outcomes. These effects threaten to limit progress towards Agenda 2030. This session will explore trends, progress and good practices in how improvements in SDG 16 specifically can lead to enhancement of socio-economic opportunities.

SESSION 3: INSTITUTIONAL STRENGTHENING

Strong institutions play a key role in development, as they ensure a professional public administration and the equal application of the rule of law. This session aims to identify trends and progress

towards achievement of rule of law and access to justice for all, to identify good practices in supporting institutional strengthening for the implementation of SDG 16+, and to explore how rule of law and access to justice have been incorporated in the SDGs and in some cases into national development planning processes.
